Summer is here, what better way to enjoy spending time with loved ones than having a barbecue and enjoying great food together? With National Barbecue Week taking place from June 3rd-9th 2024, the outdoor living team at British Garden Centres has put together some tips and tricks to help you have the best barbecuing experience this summer.

Choose a Barbecue that is right for you

The debate over whether gas or charcoal is best has been ongoing for years, but the choice depends on your needs and preferences. The time it takes for the barbecue to be ready for use can vary depending on the type of barbecue gas barbecues can reach the desired temperature more quickly than charcoal models. Both types have their pros and cons: gas barbecues allow for more controlled cooking due to their consistent and accurate heat, while charcoal barbecues are versatile, can create authentic smoky flavours, and are not restricted by temperature control.

Feeling hot, hot, hot!

Controlling the heat on a gas barbecue is easy – just turn a dial. However, with a charcoal barbecue, it's a bit more complicated. Some barbecues have a temperature gauge, but if yours doesn't, you can use a simple hand test. Hold your palm about 12cm/5" above the grill and gauge the heat based on how long you can comfortably keep it there: 6 seconds for low heat, 4 seconds for medium heat, and 2 seconds for high heat. For gas BBQs, designate one side for high heat and the other for lower heat. For round BBQs, concentrate charcoal in the centre for high heat, leaving the outskirts for lower heat. With rectangular BBQs, divide the grill into halves for different heat levels.

Store your Barbecue appropriately after use

A common question people ask is whether barbecues can be left outside. We always recommend if you're storing your barbecue outside, covering it when not in use can help prolong its life and shield it from damage, especially during the winter months. British Garden Centres offer a variety of barbecue covers and shelters to help protect your barbecue.



Clean your Barbecue after every use

After using the barbecue, allow it to cool down to a warm temperature before attempting to clean it, as this will help remove any food residue left on the grill. If the barbecue has fully cooled down, you can heat the grates and use a grill brush, such as the Weber grill brush, to remove any food residue. After that, wash the barbecue grates with soapy water and rinse to remove any soap. To clean the outside of the barbecue enamel or stainless steel, you can use cleaners to keep your barbecue looking its best.

Choose the right accessories
